**“Concerned Black Clergy Elects New President”**  
*Installation Ceremony to be held January 30<sup>th</sup>*

FULTON—The Concerned Black Clergy of Metropolitan Atlanta, Inc. (CBC) has selected Reverend Frank Cornelius Brown, Sr. Pastor of Mt. Olive Missionary Baptist Church to serve as the new president elect to lead the organization’s many initiatives.

The Installation Ceremony is scheduled for Monday, January 30<sup>th</sup> 10:00 a.m. at Community Church of God, located at 838 Cascade Road, S.W., Atlanta, Georgia. A reception honoring the President, Officers and Board of Directors will take place immediately following the ceremony at Vicars Community Center, which is next door to the event location. The Honorable Belinda Edwards, Chief Judge For Fulton County Juvenile Court will commence the oath to all newly elected officers of Concerned Black Clergy.

Reverend Brown has served as senior pastor to Mt. Olive Missionary Baptist Church in the Ben Hill Community of SW Atlanta since December 2006. Prior to serving as senior pastor to Mt. Olive, he was an active member for twenty one years at the Historic Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta and later accepted the call to Christian ministry to preach the gospel in November 2002. Reverend Brown was licensed by his mentor, Dr. Joseph L. Roberts and ordained by hi pastor Dr. Raphael Warnock, of Ebenezer Baptist Church..

Reverend Brown has worked extensively in the Technology Industry for over eighteen years and was most recently employed as National Account Manager with SED International, a distributor of computer and peripheral products in Tucker, Georgia.

Reverend Brown matriculated through the public school system in Roanoke, Virginia, received a major in Business Administration with a minor in Information Systems from Winston-Salem State University in North Carolina and in May 2006, he received a Master of Divinity degree from the Interdenominational Theological Center and the Morehouse School of Religion.

Reverend Brown has previously served as a member of the Board of Directors and as Vice President of Clergy Programs for Concerned Black Clergy of Metro Atlanta in addition to being

affiliated with The New Era State Missionary Baptist Convention of Georgia; the Regional Council of Churches in Atlanta; Board Member of SWEEAC, the Southwest Ecumenical Emergency Assistance Center and a neighborhood advocate for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Foundation and a variety of other community service oriented organizations.

Reverend Brown is married to First Lady Linda Denise Scott Brown and has three children, Whitney, Charmaine, and Joshua.
